It's Spring! Hooray! Now is the time to be peeling bark that can be used in baskets. Winter has left us, hopefully and the trees will soon stop hugging their sap and the bark will be easier to pull. Molly will demonstrate how to harvest and prepare local bark for use in basketry. She also will have information on local plants used for weaving, such as vines, leaves and roots.

Appalachian Egg Basket Thursday, April 17, 2014 9:00 - 3:00 up to 5:00

Cost of class: \$15.00 members; \$20.00 non-members Materials fee: \$20.00



Tools needed: Usual tools...soaking pan, spray bottle, shears, and especially an awl. If you have it, bring your Stanley sure-form shaver. Karen Zane recommends this to shape your ribs.

We will be working with 2 10" unfinished Oak hoops. I will sand them (they're pretty rough) and if you want a finish on yours BEFORE you weave your basket, I can bring them to the meeting in April and after your materials fee is paid, you can take a pair home and stain/finish them as you wish. We will be making a God's Eye start with dyed or undyed 3/16" flat oval reed, weavers can be as plain or colorful as you would like. The entire basket can be woven of undyed 1/4" flat reed (a more traditional approach), or you can make it as colorful as you would like. I will have dyed and undyed 1/4" flat, dyed and undyed #2 & #3 round reed, sea grass, and some dyed sisal. Sisal can be purchased at Home Depot in a large cylinder-shaped roll.

Community outreach classes in Carson City by GBB members will be advertised on the GBB website. Instructors will be asked to hand out GBB brochures, potentially recruiting new members.


