

This is a fun basket made with a juice carton, recycled bags and any additional recycled materials that you may have, like the plastic netted bags that onions and tomatoes sometimes come in, pull-tabs from juice cartons, straws, or aluminum soda tabs for a cool rim effect. You will need scissors, ruler, a few clothespins, pen and pencil, and the recycled items mentioned above (please wash and dry the juice carton so it won't be sticky or smelly.) It will be fun and creative—no two will be the same!

The class will be from 9:30 to 3:00 but it will probably not take that long. The class fee is \$15, \$20 for non-members. There is no material fee. Please bring materials mentioned above as directed. April will have extra to share.

3-Rod Wale Basket with Carol Thomas

The 2011 GBB Retreat at the beautiful Zephyr Point Presbyterian Conference Center at Lake Tahoe is upon us and it is time to make your final payment of \$185. If you haven't already made the commitment to attend the May 17th-May 20th event you can still sign up. The total cost for this year's retreat is \$220—that includes room and board and three workshops. Wednesday will be the full day workshops with participants choosing either a small Pine Needle Basket with Lid (no material fees) taught by Linda Havens, or a Double 3-Rod Wale Basket (\$15 material fee) taught by Carol Thomas. If you haven't signed up for either one yet, please let us know when you pay the balance of the retreat fees. On Thursday, we have scheduled two half day workshops, both to be offered in the morning and the afternoon, that way everyone has the opportunity to take both workshops. Our half day workshops are a Woven Fiber Rush Footstool (\$10.50 material fee) with Joan O'Brien and a Painted Paper Twill Weave Basket (\$5 material fee) with Karen Olson. We are going to assemble and glue the footstools at the May meeting; then you will be able to take them home to stain or paint, that way they will be ready to weave on at the retreat. If you are unable to attend the May meeting (for those of you living out of town) then we will have a gluing session Tuesday night. We will bring a variety of stains for you to use on them; but if you want to paint your footstool you will need to bring the paint to the retreat. If you have any questions about the footstools please contact Joan O'Brien at 849-3442.

For those of you who have never been to the retreat—we have 2 days of basket making workshops-Wednesday and Thursday, fun filled evening activities, a great basket raffle and a silent auction. It's a wonderful event and a great getaway for everyone; the setting is gorgeous and the camaraderie is awesome. Something new this year: Meg Price, a Certified Personal Trainer, will be organizing morning and late afternoon stretching and flexibility sessions—what a beautiful setting. Of course, the evening activities will include card games with the Spite and Malice crew on hand to teach us how to play; or if you are not a card player, we'll have some quick woven projects to do and everyone will be encouraged to paint their watercolor paper for their Thursday twill weave basket. There is never a lack of activities at the retreat. Thursday night will be the finale with the raffle and silent auction; as well as singing the song of GBB. Cornelia Kallerud will be handling the raffle/silent auction again this year—if you cannot bring your raffle basket to the May meeting, you can either bring it directly to the retreat or if you want to participate in the Raffle Basket Contest you can mail it to Karen Olson.

<u>Library Report</u>: Nothing new to report. <u>Publicity Report:</u> Nothing new to report. E-Bulletin Report: Nothing new to report.



Antler Art for Baskets and Gourds, by Betsey Sloan


