August 1st Program, Tension Tray with Joan O'Brien

This tray can be woven from round reed or willow that has been dried and re-soaked for a more rustic look.

Joan O'Brien will provide #6 round reed which will make a small 6" tray. If you have reed you would like to use, please bring it. Round

reed #8 will make a 10" tray, #7 will make an 8" tray, and #5 will make 4" coasters. Please bring scissors and a tape measure if you plan to participate in the program.
