- Meeting called to order 11:05am by Susan Lester at First Congregational Church.
- Minutes approved with no corrections as printed.
- ♦ Treasurer's report given by Bonnie Kennedy.
- Membership report given by Karen Olsen.
   We now have 104 paid members with two new members.
- Meetings program report was given by Susan Lester. Our July meeting will be at April Barber's and we will be learning knotless netting. Molly reported on today's program which included presenters Cherlyn Bennett, Mary Lee Fulkerson, and Molly Gardner sharing their knowledge and expertise about presenting your art, bringing the true you out in your work and tips and ideas about teaching and sharing your craft.
- Monthly workshops report was given by Sande Rowan. Cherlyn Bennett spoke about the paper making class she will teach at her house June 19th.
- Molly Gardner reviewed details about her two day class June 21-22 working with birch bark.
- Betty Hulse spoke about her class weaving a small basket of natural materials Friday June 27th.
- Kaylee Mayne's class making a wine basket is scheduled June 28th.
- Susan reported on Lauren Lampe's class June 27th learning to make a star base mini basket, Susan's dream catcher class Aug 29th, and Judy Magiera's class Aug. 16th learning how to make a dragonfly.
- Special workshops report. April gave overview of our retreat at Lake Tahoe.
- Exhibits/Shows report given by Susan who thanked Sande Rowan for the excellent job setting up the Carson City library exhibit for May.

- Phyliss has another exhibit set for 2015.
- Special projects/events report: April Barber and Karen Olson advised Zephyr Point is requesting a non-refundable deposit for the 2015 retreat be paid by June 2014. April and Karen researched other sites and reported their findings. Also changing the date for the retreat was debated. After discussions motion made by Sande and seconded by Karen to change the date. 
