Basketry Workshops

January 15, 2011 9:30 am - 3:00 pm Sky Peaks Community Room Cherokee Wheel Basket Instructor: Cat Mena

This is a great basket for beginning weavers, as well as more experienced weavers. The class will concentrate on several different weaving techniques. This surface technique is accomplished on an even number of spokes with light wheels on dark dyed background.

Class Fee:: \$15 members, \$20 non-members + \$5 material fee. You will need your regular basketry tools and your lunch.

This is a twill basket based on a pattern from Joan Moore/Lyn Siler. We will be using flat oval reed.

If you wish to bring your own materials you will need:



- 1) ¼ or 7mm flat oval reed for the spokes and weavers, the weavers are natural and the spokes are dyed—three different shades.
- 2) 38 spokes 26" long—16 a light color, 16 a dark color, and 6 a medium color.
- 3) 3/16" flat reed for rim.
- 4) ½" or 3/8" flat oval reed for rim.
- 5) Fine cane for lashing
- 6) #5 or 6 round reed for rim filler.

I can supply the materials for a \$15 fee. We will be using space dyed reed. Also be sure to bring all your regular basketry tools, scissors/clippers, awl, spray bottle and soaking tub, spoke weight (if you have one not essential), pencil, knife or plane for rim, small towel, and be sure to bring a lunch.

Hopefully we will be able to finish the basket, the rim always takes some time. Class fee \$15 members/\$20 non-member + \$15 material fee. For more info or questions contact Carol Thomas at plantweaver@sbcglobal.net or (775) 345-0161.

PINE NEEDLE BASKET WORKSHOP

Tues, February 15, 2011 & Thurs, February 17, 2011

9:30 am - 3:00 pm

Tuesday's workshop will concentrate on pine needle basket starts. You will learn three separate starts, one of which you will complete at home. This start will be the base of your Thursday basket workshop. On Thursday you will begin forming the sides of your basket using the Mariposa Stitch. You will also learn how to end your basket. The fee for the 2 day class is \$50.00 payable to Margaret Marshall at the time of sign-ups. If you have any questions, please call me at (775) 825-4307.



MATERIALS NEEDED FOR THE THREE STARTS AND FOR THE MARIPOSA STITCH BASKET:

A nice bundle of dyed pine needles, a couple of Chenille and Tapestry needles (I think they are #18), one spool of #3 waxed linen thread, either matching or a contrasting color to the dyed pine needles and a small pair of scissors. Needle nose pliers are always helpful. For the other two starts you can use dyed or natural pine needles and raffia and/or artificial sinew. I do not recommend raffia or artificial sinew for the project basket as neither are stable enough to hold the rows apart. If you bring raffia for your non-project starts, please being a small tub to dampen your raffia. If you wish to use artificial sinew, you may order from Allen's Basket Works, (760)320-4467. I use **Tan** Sinew, 400 '. Last time I purchased it was \$12.50 + shipping.

To begin a basket, pine needles must be damp. The night before the workshop, soak the needles in hot water for about an hour. Then wrap in about 6 to 10 sections of damp paper towel and place in a plastic bag (I use the bag our newspaper comes in). Put in refrigerator to mellow overnight.

(DON'T FORGET TO REMOVE THEM FROM REFRIGERATOR IN THE MORNING AND BRING THEM TO THE WORKSHOP!!!)

PINE NEEDLE DYING INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1) Wash <u>8-ounces pine needles</u> then soak separately for about 20 minutes.
- 2) Mix ½ gallon of water and 3 TBS Angleus leather dye in a metal cooking pot (large enough to submerge pine needles) and bring to a boil.
- 3) Add cleaned and soaked pine needles to the boiling water and dye.
- 4) After boiling needles for 20 minutes, add 1 cup vinegar.
- 5) Boil for additional 10 minutes (boil longer if you want needles darker, use you judgment).
- 6) Remove pine needles and rinse thoroughly with cold water.
- 7) Lay pine needles out on newspaper to dry.
- 8) Do not use pine needles until completely dry as they shrink.

NOTE: The ingredient amounts should be doubled for 16 ounces of pine needles. It is not recommended to dye more than 16 ounces of pine needles in a batch.

GBB E Bulletin Board—Policy and Procedure


