

GBB Board Meeting

The GBB Board will meet on Tuesday, July 17 at 10:30 a.m. in Carson City at the Business Resources Innovation Center (BRIC) at 108 E Proctor Street. GBB members are welcome to attend. Items on the agenda include a revision of the GBB Policies and Procedures which will be presented at the August GBB meeting.

Coming from the north, take 395 south towards Carson City. Exit at off ramp #61—S. Virginia exit by the pink Scolaris—go right, then take the first right at Holcomb Ranch Ln. Go about 1.7 miles to Dryden Dr. on your left, turn then take the first right hand street, Fairview Rd. Go up the hill to the stop sign at Fairview and Lamay—we are located across Lamay on the right hand corner.

If you are coming from the south on 395, take the South Meadows exit. Turn left towards S. Virginia, then turn right on S. Virginia. Holcomb Ranch Ln. will be on the left across from and just past Les Schwab Tire—which is on the right. There is a car dealer on the corner, then follow the same previous directions to Dryden Dr.

July Program-Dying the Natural Way

We will be dying silk scarves the natural way with flower heads. Cut your flower heads while they still have plenty of color in them and freeze in a gallon ziploc bag. Keep frozen until the day of the meeting. Roses seem to dye really well as do iris, and daffodils. I have quite a few bags of flowers

so if you want to make a scarf but don't have the flowers no worries. The bag you freeze them in is what you will be dying your scarf in. **There are no guarantees as to what color you will end up with.** If you want to do something different you can roll the scarf around a rusty tool. The rust

makes a very neat design.

I ordered silk scarves that are 11"x60", and will have them all ready to dye for the July

meeting. I will bring the instructions on the mordant to the program. Please contact me at

This a short but fun process and it is fun to watch the results develop into a pretty silk scarf.

Wool Gizzard Basket with Linda Pietz 3rd Thursday - July 19, 2012 9:30 am to 3:30 pm Sky Peaks Retirement Community Room

Linda's sister is a McGowan certified traditional rug hooking instructor. Linda writes: "I design patterns which are on our website at nolahooks.com. While visiting last summer, out of boredom I started making cordage out of some of her gizzards which are the strips used in making the rugs. I thought why not coil this; it looks pretty good. Thus the wool gizzard basket was born. I have since made a basket with the wool cordage on a gourd. I love the colorful

randomness of this basket. By the way, some hookers call the gizzards worms. I like gizzards better."

The wool gizzard basket combines two historic techniques to create this unique basket. Taking skinny strips of wool in a variety of color which are used in traditional rug hooking, we will make cordage that will then be coiled into a colorful basket using perle cotton as the binding material. The basket is both strong and light. Tools: Bring sharp scissors and a #18 tapestry needle. All other materials will be included in the kit.

Class fee is \$15 for members/\$20 for non-members. Materials fee: \$20.



FYI - By Pat Wescott

It occurred to me as I was writing up the information for the upcoming mask class that Cheryln and I are going to teach, that some people may not realize that the possession of predator, song birds and migratory bird feathers is illegal. If one uses these found feather on a piece of art and you try to show it, the Department of Fish and Game can confiscate it and fine you. This is the case with animal furs as well.

A great source of feathers, fur, bones, teeth, quills, claws, antlers, horn, etc. is Moscow Hide and Fur in Moscow, Id. 83843 http://www.hidesandfur.com or 208-882-0601

Feathers obtain from hunted water fowl or game birds are ok. I have found that white turkey feathers can be dyed or painted to look like real raptor feathers. Tandy's also does a great job of producing faux furs from rabbit skins.

From the Nevada Dept. of Fish and Game: The possession of feathers and other parts from MBTA-protected birds without permission is prohibited. The only exceptions are the feathers of legally-hunted waterfowl or other migratory game birds, which may be possessed by hunters. This prohibition extends to molted feathers and to feathers taken from road- or window-killed birds. Individuals or institutions wishing to use bird feathers, bones, or whole specimens for educational or research purposes must apply for permits from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and their state wildlife or natural resource agency. 









Knotless Netting Class - "Smilies"


