WILLOW CLASSES WITH BONNIE GALE AT THE CANING

SHOP IN BERKELEY ON OCTOBER 25-26th, 2014





Bonnie Gale, nationally recognized willow artist, residing in central New York, will present a weekend

of willow classes on October 25th and 26th, 2014 at the Caning Shop in Berkeley. She will teach two one-day classes and one two-day class over the weekend. The one day classes will be taught on both days. All three basket s being offered have been designed by Bonnie. She is offering the Early American Life Lunch Basket (a good beginner willow basket designed by Bonnie for the Early American Life magazine) for one day as well as the Oval Muffin Basket as a second one day class.

The Oval Muffin Basket is a good introduction to the techniques of oval willow work. The Willow Backpack is being offered for two days and is an intermediate level basket. Cloth straps are included in the price, although custom leather straps with brass hardware are available for an additional charge. In addition, there will be a presentation on Bonnie's Woven Living Willow Structures Power Point on Saturday night at another location. Pre-registration is required with a minimum of 50% deposit of the tuition. A

supply list of tools will be provided at registration time. As Bonnie needs to send the materials ahead of time, she does need to have registrations by October 10. She leaves New York on October 15th. For more information and to register, please contact the Caning Shop at 1-800-544-3373.


