THIS DESIGN IS A REPRODUCTION OF AN OLD BASKET MADE IN PENNSYLVANIA OF RYE STRAW. IT IS A POPULAR BEGINNER'S BASKET AND LOOKS PARTICULARLY GOOD EITHER HANGING ON A HEARTH BY ITS WIRE HANDLE OR DECORATING A TABLETOP. FINISHED BAS-KET IS APPROXIMATELY 9" AT TOP BY 7" TALL.

THIS IS ANOTHER GREAT CLASS FOR BEGINNERS ON UP! <u>EVERYTHING</u> YOU NEED WILL BE ALREADY TO GO SO YOU CAN SPEND YOUR TIME WEAVING. YOUR KIT WILL INCLUDE THE WIRE AND WOOD HANDLE WITH EYELETS, PRECUT AND MARKED SPOKES, FALSE RIM, TRUE RIMS AND SEA GRASS FILLER. **PLEASE BRING**: YOUR LUNCH AND A DRINK, SCISSORS, A TOWEL TO KEEP WET REED IN, PENCIL, SPRAY BOTTLE, TAPE MEASURE, AWL, A STRAIGHT BLADE SCREW DRIVER (ABOUT 6 INCHES LONG 1/4" WIDE BLADE), OR PACKING TOOL, A <u>SHARP</u> POCKET KNIFE (TO TRIM DOWN THE RIM PIECES) AND A PIECE OF 2X4 ABOUT 4 TO 6 INCHES LONG. IF YOU HAVE THEM, A SPOKE WEIGHT AND LASH BUDDY. I WILL HAVE A FEW EXTRA TOOLS AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE. THERE IS ONLY <u>ONE</u> OPENING LEFT FOR THIS CLASS.

September Program

Immediately following the Sept. 6 meeting

Aboy ye Mateys! Come join in for a YO HO HO good time creating a treasured box possibly full of precious memories.

1.You'll need to bring **12** of whatever you want on the inside and outside of your box. Suggestions: A. greeting cards- special event such as Christmas, Birthday, Anniversary, Congrats on a New Baby etc., B. Theme from magazine- pictures for birdwatchers, dog lovers, artists, sport players. C. Your favorite photos of yourself or others. D. Favorite poems or sayings typed or scanned into your computer and printed on special paper. E. Your child's artwork or your own.

2. Thin cardboard such as soda can cartons, cereal boxes, cat food boxes. You'll need 6 6"X 6" pieces of cardboard per box.

3. Thin, stiff, clear plastic from merchandise packaging or Karen said she'd bring her laminating machine or you can leave the pictures unprotected.

4. Scissors, pencil or pen, glue stick

5. Something to connect the pieces together such as yarn, crochet thread, waxed linen, ribbon 1/8" to 1/4", sinew, or twine

6. If you want a border around each side, please bring construction paper, special paper, marker pen, gold or silver leafing pen.

7. If you are crocheting the box together bring crochet hook the size to fit your thread or yarn.

8. Darning needle if you are going to use other things such as ribbon with the needle hole being big enough

9. Favorite hole punch shape. I have a round 1/4", two round 1/8" and a rectangle one, and if I can find it a heart shape.

10. And finally some object you want to hook a loop over to hold the lid down. Bead, small pine cone, charm, seed pod, etc.

My Twenty Years in Great Basin Basketmakers By Billie Walker

As I think back on how I became a basket maker I realize I've forgotten a lot of the details. I'm writing what I can remember. If any of you remember more, or remember it differently, please write it down and send it to the newsletter editor.

I used to tell my friends that I was going to take up basket making and weaving when I retired, in June 1987. My friend Nancy Diehl called and said she saw an article in the newspaper written by Mary Lee Fulkerson about a six week course in baskets that she was teaching in Reno. I called and signed up. During each class she had a short slide show, then taught us how to weave a simple basket. I never finished mine in class, but worked on it during the week and had it done by the next class.

Mary Lee said she was getting a group of interested people to meet each month to make baskets and whoever was interested could join. She named the group Great Basin Basketmakers. I think two class members joined the group.

We met at McKinley School by the Truckee river. When I joined we had twelve founding members and an occasional drop-in. The school charged us \$12.00 to use the room so each person contributed \$1.00. If we had less than twelve people come, we would put in more money. If we had more folks, we saved the extra money. Kathy Ralston was elected Treasurer. Some say she kept the money in an envelope under her mattress and was always worried someone would break into her home and steal it.

We weren't organized enough to have meetings so we had no officers. We just sat around and made baskets. Mary Lee usually taught us, but if anyone had a basket they had made, they would teach everyone "how to do it".

In 1987 there weren't many "how to" books or places to buy supplies. Dora Taylor and Jeanie McClard were probably the most experienced and taught lots of classes. Once they bought a bunch of gourds and experimented with them. They had a class outside on the lawn at McKinley. We had a hose and towels and scrubbed the gourds, used drywall saws to cut them open and scraped the seeds and pulp out with grapefruit spoons.

One by one, new people joined the group. Most were beginners. Mary Lee got books, experimented and then gave workshops.
